### President's Column Cape Haze Development Questionnaire

This past year has seen a significant amount of maintenance in Cape Haze, including rebuilding of the CHPOA dock on Don Pedro Island and the complete replacement of all water supply lines in the Clubhouse. We've also used Common Area Maintenance funds to redo the landscaping at all three entrances, including replanting and the installation of concrete edging around all planting areas.

CHPOA's reserve funds were sufficient to cover some of these projects and the dock replacement was handled by securing a 15-year loan from Englewood bank. However, in dealing with these necessary repairs, the question naturally arose: "what else could we be doing for the Community?"

To answer that question, Marty Rosen convened a Development Committee to brainstorm various ideas for future proactive projects within Cape Haze. He and his committee have created an explanatory letter that will soon be arriving in the mailboxes of all members (unless you were in attendance at the April general meeting, in which case you already have a copy). The intent is to poll the membership to learn what improvements, if any would be broadly supported.

To their credit, Marty and his team did not limit their thinking and they worked "outside the box" in putting together their list of possible projects. They range from small (improvements to the beach property) to huge (replacement of the Clubhouse). Maybe we'd like to pursue all these suggestions, maybe we'd like to pursue none of them, or maybe we'd like just one or two. Or maybe we'd like to pursue something altogether different from what the Development Committee has suggested. There's a place on the questionnaire for you to suggest your own ideas.

It's important to recognize that this is only a questionnaire. It is not a ballot. Your response to the questionnaire will not authorize any projects. It will simply point us in the right direction. If one or more projects enjoy universal support, the committee will generate detailed cost estimates and project plans to which we'll all have input.

Only after we have those detailed plans and estimates will the project be put before the membership for approval. And only after approval by a majority of the membership in a formal vote will any funds be committed.

It's all in your hands. The Development Committee needs to hear your thoughts, so please respond to your questionnaire. Ask yourself what new amenities you'd like to see in Cape Haze, if any, or how you'd like the Community to look in 5 or 10 years. And if your answer is "I don't support any projects", please say so on your returned questionnaire. Don't indicate your lack of support by failing to respond – we can't hear your voice if you don't speak. Thank you for your input.

## Cape Hazers Place Second in International Sailing Regatta

Cape Haze sailors Jack (Don) Hagan and Homer Hoe skippered the *Leslie Ann II* to second place in the True Cruising Class of the international sailing race *Regatta Sol al Sol*. Additional crewmembers were previous Cape Hazer Chris Hinds, Sandy Stewart of Ocala and Ted Parsons of Bradenton.

This was the first time the crew had sailed together much less participated in this prestigious and demanding regatta. Jack laughingly said the 48'5" Island Packet Sailboat was on its "shake down cruise." Congratulations to you all, we're very proud to know you.

The first *Regatta Del Sol al Sol* was held in 1969 and it has been conducted each year since. The 36<sup>th</sup> regatta began in St. Petersburg, Florida and finished four days later in Isla Mujeres, Mexico (north of Cancun). The race is handicapped on the Performance Handicap Rating Formula for a distance of 500 nautical miles and is a navigators' race in that the course crosses three major current complexes.

This year's race was quite successful with 24 boats participating. The first two hours there was no wind and the *Leslie Ann II* had to drop anchor to avoid drifting back to the starting line. However, the remainder of the race saw 25-knot winds, big seas and clear sailing all the way to Mexico.

Co-sponsored by the St. Petersburg Yacht Club and the Club De Yates de Isla Mujeres, this charitable event raises money to help the people of Mexico. Last year provided a fire truck and ambulance and this year additional emergency equipment as well as school supplies will be donated.

Jack and Leslie Hagan, both physicians, retired last August and now spend their time between Ocala and Cape Haze. The Hagans have three children and they are very proud of each of them. Their son, Jack, and his wife, Helen, are both Navy M.D.'s stationed in North Carolina. Their daughter Catherine, also a Navy M.D., is stationed in Panama City and daughter Mary Simson is in advertising and marketing in Ocala.

Both Jack and Leslie enjoy golf and breed and raise thoroughbred horses. Leslie also has a photography business specializing in nature subjects.

Homer and Julie Hoe moved to Cape Haze in the fall of 2000 and spend their summer months in the mountains of Colorado. Homer is probably best known as President of CHPOA (and we thank him for his countless hours of work on our behalf). 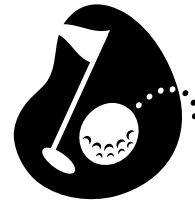

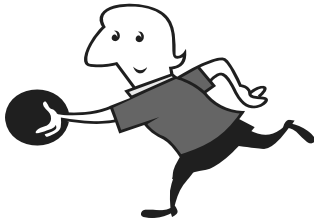

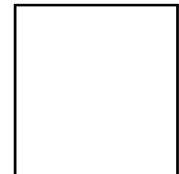
